



## Any tips on taking care of my Maui Jims?

Your sunglasses are coated with an anti-reflective (A/R) coating which is essential in eliminating glare and is one of the three elements that make up our patented design. As with any quality product, tender loving care will enhance and prolong the usefulness of your sunglasses and protect your investment.

### General Cleaning

On a regular basis, rinse the lenses in warm, running water. Use a mild liquid dish or bath soap to wash each lens surface. Rinse and dry using a clean, soft absorbent cloth. Do not use paper-based products to clean your lenses. Do not use abrasive cleaners or soaps and detergents which may leave a deposit on the lens. Also, avoid cleaning your lenses with certain tissues that have lotion or silicone added, as both will leave a film on the lenses.

### Cleaning Anti-Reflective Lenses

Your A/R coated lenses are so clear that small smudges and spots will probably be visible. Additionally, any grease or oil on the lens (from fingers, eyebrows, or hair) will become visible as a rainbow-like reflection. Routine and careful cleaning of your A/R lenses will minimize smudges and spots and result in improved product performance.

### Chemicals

Certain common household chemicals will react negatively with the lens coatings. For best results, avoid contact with: acetone (nail polish remover), caustic solutions (window and oven cleaner), hair sprays containing methylene (listed on label), and chlorine (from swimming pools or laundry water).

### Heat

Excessive heat commonly found on the dash board of your car, hot water radiators, stove tops, etc., may deteriorate the coatings over time. Please avoid placing your glasses in any area where you might expect excessive heat. It may result in the cracking of the coating.

### Scratching

Though your lenses are resistant to light scratching - heavier, abusive scratching will likely break through the A/R coating and cause visible marks on the lenses. Good handling and cleaning practices will significantly minimize scratching.

### Hard Water

Hard water allowed to dry on the surface of your lenses will leave visible water spots which are difficult to remove. Clean and thoroughly dry your lenses immediately if splashed with hard water or water from an unknown source (such as a sprinkler or pool).

### Fitting & Adjusting

If you need to adjust Maui Jim Sunglasses for a better fit, as a general rule, please warm the nylon frame before bending or shaping it to fit. Generally this is best handled by an eyewear professional.

### Hardware

We recommend that you visit your local sunglass retailer periodically to have them tighten the eyewire screws and those attaching temples and nose pads.
